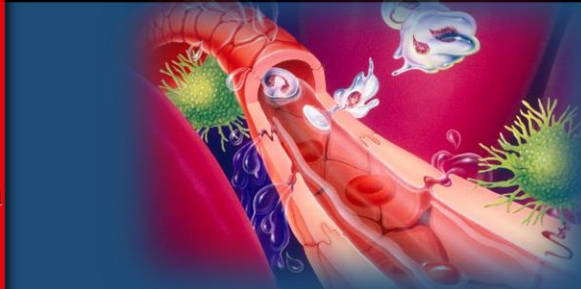
Presentation will cover prehospital treatment of sepsis and septic shock, as well as the in-hospital course of treatment for patients suffering sepsis.

SIRS T: >100.4 F < 96.8 F RR: >20 HR: >90 WBC: >12,000 <4,000 >10% bands PCO2 < 32 mmHg	SEPSIS 2 SIRS + Confirmed or suspected infection	SEVERE SEPSIS Sepsis + Signs of End Organ Damage Hypotension (SBP <90) Lactate >4 mmol	SEPTIC SHOCK Severe Sepsis with persistent: Signs of End Organ Damage Hypotension (SBP <90) Lactate >4 mmol
