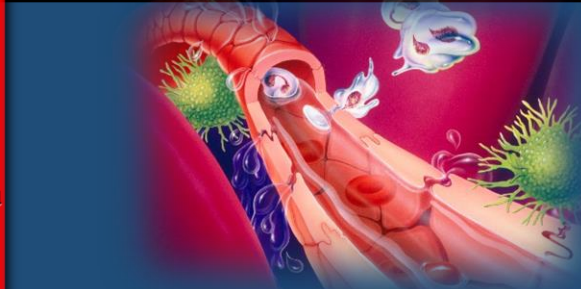
Presentation will cover prehospital treatment of sepsis and septic shock, as well as the in-hospital course of treatment for patients suffering sepsis.

## SEPSIS STEPS

<b>SIRS</b> T: >100.4 F < 96.8 F RR: >20 HR: >90 WBC: >12,000 <4,000 >10% bands PCO2 < 32 mmHg	<b>SEPSIS</b> 2 SIRS + Confirmed or suspected infection	<b>SEVERE SEPSIS</b> Sepsis + Signs of End Organ Damage Hypotension (SBP <90) Lactate >4 mmol	<b>SEPTIC SHOCK</b> Severe Sepsis with persistent: Signs of End Organ Damage Hypotension (SBP <90) Lactate >4 mmol
