Pieter Van Horn began his EMS career in 1997 as a basic EMT for the Greece Volunteer Ambulance Service in Greece NY. In 1999 he was accepted into the Daemen College PA program in Amherst NY whereby he was a member of the first Master's Educated PA Class in NY State at the time.

He attended Intermediate and continued on to Paramedic school at night while attending PA school during the day.

Pieter worked for Twin City Ambulance as an EMT, EMT-I, and Field Training Officer (FTO) Paramedic from 1999 to 2004.

Upon finishing PA school in May of 2004, Pieter was Commissioned into the United States Public Health Service as a Physician Assistant, his first duty station being with the Federal Bureau of Prisons at FCI Manchester in Manchester Kentucky. Pieter returned to the Buffalo area in 2008 where he worked as a Physician Assistant with the Division of Immigration Health Services at the Buffalo Federal Detention Facility in Batavia NY.

Pieter's responsibilities with the Federal Bureau of Prisons included Infection Disease Coordinator and Health Services Administrator.

In 2016 Pieter transferred back to Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) working as the Eastern Regional Health Services Administrator for Ice Health Service Corps (IHSC) in downtown Buffalo, a position he still currently holds. In this role Pieter oversees all the ICE Hospitals on the Eastern coast of the United States, and one facility in Texas.
